2011 Huron Fringe Birding Festival

The 14th annual Huron Fringe Birding Festival took place over two weekends in late May and early June 2011. We had about eighty events on birding, geology, plants, flowers, trees and photography, and other unique events.

New this year was the off-site Banquet at Piper's Glen Golf Club, where 100 people enjoyed an excellent meal catered by Mary Ellen Harrigan, followed by a unique three way presentation by Ethan Meleg, Mark Wiercinski and John Haselmayer (Birders gone wild on the Bruce). Our Master of Ceremony, John Cummings, added to the light hearted ambience to the evening. A silent auction conducted by Norah Toth was very successful, generating about \$800.00 for the bird blind project at the DU pond, to be built on the east side almost opposite the existing tower.

Again this year we were fortunate to have a water colour painting donated by Doug Martin to raffle, with funds going to the Bird Blind. This effort, with ticket sales at the Friend's Store and with Friends president Stewart Nutt actively selling tickets, earned \$406.00. The raffle was drawn on the second Sunday at lunch and presented to the winner.

Another first was a geology bus trip which was successfully attended. We hope to include bus trips at future festivals.

I would like to thank all our participants for attending this year. Your continuing support assures the success of the Festival and that it will continue to thrive for years to come. We thank you for your feedback by filling out our surveys. Your comments help us improve the Festival from year to year.

We had some rough weather on the second Saturday with power outages in the park. We were not seriously affected but we appreciate the patience and understanding of our participants.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the volunteer committee members, our sponsors both corporate and private, Ontario Parks, the Visitor Center staff, Friends Store staff,

Maintenance, and the Friends of MacGregor Point Park, the Rotary Club (BBQ lunches), and all our Event Coordinator Volunteers for supporting and assisting with the Festival. Without this huge effort by our volunteers we would not have a Festival.

Planning for the Festival in 2012 is already under way. The Festival is planned for May 25 to May 28 and May 31 to June 3.

Thanks again to everyone for a successful Festival.



Bird Blind Update

For the past two years the Friends have been raising funds for the construction of a bird blind (hide) to be located in the Ducks Unlimited wetland area of the park. The blind will enable bird watchers to have an enhanced birding experience by being able to get closer to the birds without disturbing them.

The cost of the project is estimated to be about \$25,000 and is to be started this fall. To date about 80% of the funds have been raised or pledged. Generous corporate donations have come from the Nuclear Waste Management Organization and TD Friends of the Environment Foundation. As well many individuals and families have contributed. A significant contribution was received from funds raised as a result of the Huron Fringe Birding Festival. Donations in excess of \$100 will be permanently recognized at the site.

If you would like to help us reach our goal, you can give at the visitor centre or mail the Friends a cheque. Just specify that the donation is for the bird blind.



In the second year that we hosted at MacGregor Point, Ingrid and I agreed to serve a week in the Visitor Centre. This involves spending four hours each day (11:00 A.M. - 3:00 P.M.) in the Centre welcoming guests and fielding their questions.

We start each day by opening the Centre. Throughout the day we sell raffle tickets for the park, and items in the *Huron Fringe Shop* for the *Friends*. We keep the Centre tidy and do chores assigned by Norah or Matt. Some weeks the hosts are required to run the projector for a movie night.

It is important to be knowledgeable about the park. Guests, young and old, have many questions. Most often we are asked whether bears, coyotes, deer or wolves have been seen in the park. Sometimes we are asked for directions to the Park Store, the Turtle Pond or to the beach. Guests wonder how long the park store is open, and where to meet for park events. Perhaps the most enjoyable kind of questions deal with the unique park birds, trees or plants that campers just can't wait to identify. Often that means searching in one of the many field guides or on the posters in the Centre or simply asking one of the park staff for the answer.

Whether you host in the campground or at the Visitor Centre, you soon discover it is wonderful to belong to the family of hosts, staff, *Friends* and supporters of MacGregor Point Provincial Park.
